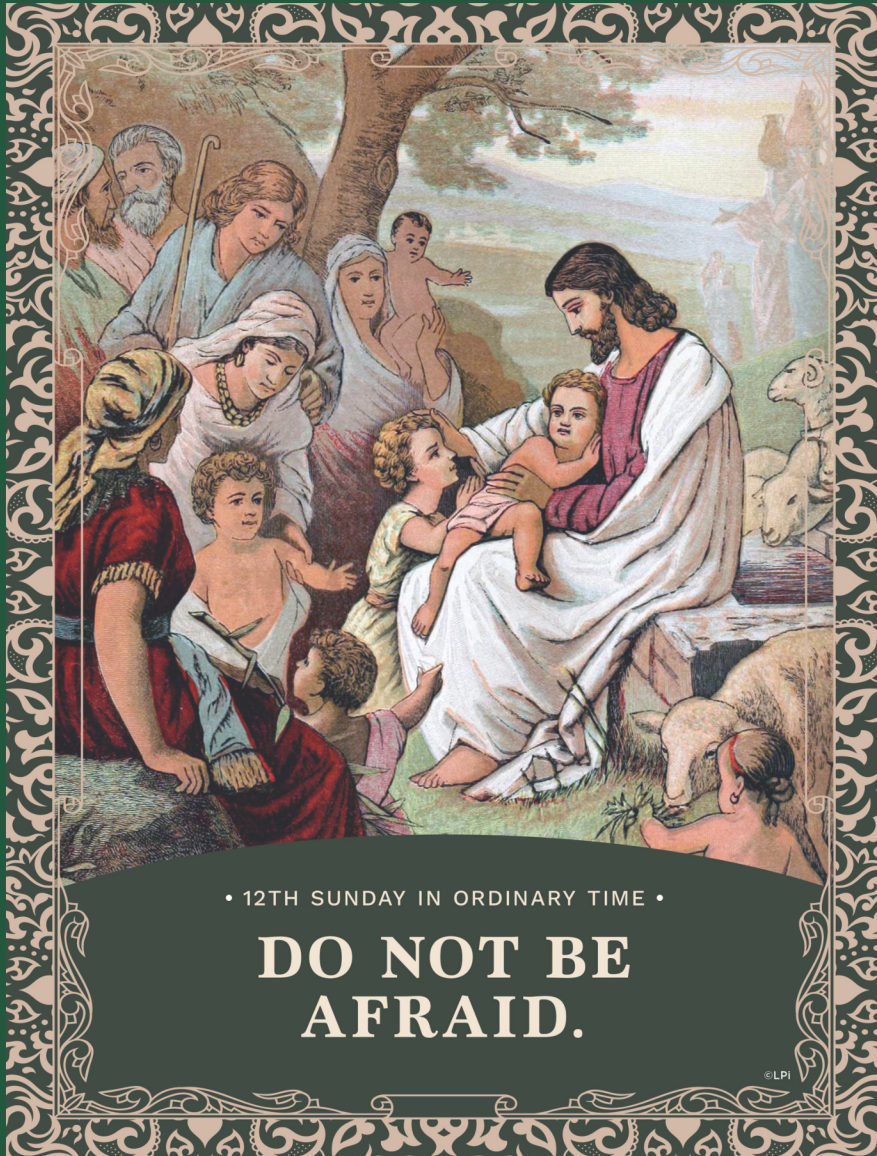

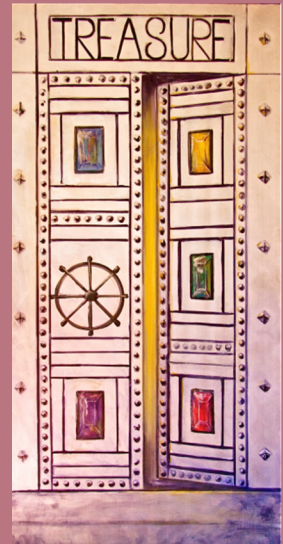

Fr. Tom's Thoughts

Dear St. James Parishioners,

Happy Father's Day to all the fathers among us! I hope everyone can appreciate the wonderment of who a father is and what a dignity it entails. This secular celebration is taking on more and more importance as fatherhood is so misrepresented in today's culture. It really is a big deal. Of course not all of our fathers have been good role models, but that doesn't mean that fatherhood is a bad thing.

Let's talk about it. Fatherhood has a great dignity in the eyes of God. Jesus actually revealed our Creator God as Father. When we pray, we raise our hearts and minds to our Heavenly Father. He wants only the best for us. He loves us unconditionally and calls us to do the same. He showed his love by sending His Son into the world to raise us up, give us an incredible dignity, and call us to an eternally important mission. Words cannot express the love we have been given. The struggle is how, in our humanity, to respond.

The best way is to accept our masculinity by being the best son, husband and father that we can be. We are to: grow in maturity and wisdom, give of ourselves, forgive others, learn from our mistakes, give witness to our faith, use our gifts to make the world a better place, and, if God calls us to marriage, to: love our spouse and children, provide and protect our family, teach our children, and basically, to be the best husband and father we can be.

I know I am so grateful for my dad. He was a great man who really took his faith seriously! We went to Mass every Sunday and we prayed the rosary together as a family often. I remember him and my mom visiting me in Turkey on the way home from their pilgrimage to Medjugorje. I took them on a tour around Turkey and remember telling him about my desire to become a priest while we sat at a bistro outside Ephesus. We also talked about death that night. It was a very special evening. We had no idea that he would die of cancer in just over a year. He was ready as he had been faithful all his life. I just hope I will be ready also.

Note to Parents of Students attending Public Schools (Grades 1-8)

Faith Reflections

I remember my Mom brushing my long, brown hair in the evening and telling me that God knew me so well and cared about me so much. God knew how many strands of hair were on my head, and how many were in the hairbrush. This is one of my favorite childhood memories. I loved having my hair brushed, and my Mom's words were so comforting. I felt safe and loved, and her words no doubt, helped me form an image of our loving God.

In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus' likewise comforting words: "Fear no one." Are not two sparrows sold for a small coin? Yet not one of them falls to the ground without your Father's knowledge." "Even all the hairs of your head are counted."

I wonder if it was on the Twelfth Sunday of Ordinary Time when my Mom first told me about my hair? Maybe she heard the Gospel for today at Mass, and was inspired to share the Good News. It happens more often than we know. We are touched by something wonderful at Mass, and tell someone about it. "Indeed, the word of God is living and effective, sharper than any two-edged sword, penetrating even between soul and spirit, joints and marrow, and able to discern reflections and thoughts of the heart." (Hebrews 4:12)

Today and every day, let us rejoice that we are known and loved by God.
